BURLINGTON COUNTY BRIDGE COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES APRIL 12, 2022

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Vice-Chairwoman Nunes moved to approve the minutes of the March 8, 2022 Commission Meeting. Commissioner Tiver seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Executive Director Andl asked the Commission to consider the following resolutions. Chairman Riggins suggested that they move Resolutions 2022-31 through 2022-36 by block. For those resolutions, Vice-Chairwoman Nunes moved to approve. Commissioner Tiver seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

The Commission considered the following resolutions:

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-31

RESOLUTION AMENDING A CONTRACT WITH PENNONI FOR DESIGN SERVICES AND THE PREPARATION OF BID DOCUMENTS FOR THE BURLINGTON BRISTOL BRIDGE TOWER SPANS DECK REPLACEMENT PROJECT

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 2022-09, the Burlington County Bridge Commission ("Commission") entered into a contract with Pennoni Associates, Inc. ("Pennoni") to perform design services and the preparation of bid documents for the Burlington Bristol Bridge ("BBB") Tower Spans Deck Replacement Project; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has determined that it is necessary to authorize the performance of additional inspection services work under the contract, and to increase the contract amount by an additional Three Hundred and Thirty Thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty Dollars (\$330,880.00).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Burlington County Bridge Commission as follows:

- 1. The terms, conditions and duties outlined in Resolution 2022-09, and the contract executed pursuant thereto, are incorporated herein by reference, and for the reasons hereinabove expressed, the required additional services are hereby authorized, and an additional sum of Three Hundred and Thirty Thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty Dollars (\$330,880.00).
- 2. Sufficient funds are available for payment for the above services provided under the contract, as evidenced by the Certificate of Availability of Funds, attached.

Vice-Chairwoman Nunes moved to approve. Commissioner Tiver seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-32

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ADOPTION OF A CASH MANAGEMENT PLAN

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:5-14 <u>et seq.</u>, a public entity such as the Burlington County Bridge Commission ("Commission") is authorized to establish a cash management plan to facilitate cash management and accountability; and

WHEREAS, the Commission auditor has advised the Commission that it is both desirable and prudent to adopt a cash management plan which has been developed by the auditor with the assistance of the administrative staff:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Burlington County Bridge Commission that for the reasons set forth above the Commission hereby authorizes the adoption of a cash management plan for the Commission, to facilitate Commission cash management and accountability, in accordance with the recommendation of the Commission auditor.

Vice-Chairwoman Nunes moved to approve. Commissioner Tiver seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-33

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE BURLINGTON COUNTY BRIDGE COMMISSION'S ADVISORY AND PAYMENT REQUEST FORM AND FEE FOR TOLL VIOLATIONS

WHEREAS, the Burlington County Bridge Commission ("Commission") has installed E-ZPass toll collection equipment on both the Tacony-Palmyra and the Burlington Bristol toll bridges; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 27:19-29, the Commission is authorized to demand tolls from any motorist who shall pass over its bridges and approaches, at such rate of toll that has been established by the Commission; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 27-36.5 establishes the Penalties for violations; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has developed the "Advisory and Payment Request Form" (attached hereto) that will be issued to toll violators by the Commission or its authorized agent for the collection of toll violations through Commission toll plazas.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Burlington County Bridge Commission as follows:

- 1. The recitals set forth above are incorporated as if set forth in full herein.
- 2. Within thirty (30) days from the date that a toll violation is recorded by the monitoring system, the Commission or its agent may send by mail to the owner of the violating vehicle an Advisory and Payment Request Form, for which the format of same is hereby approved with such additions, deletions, and or other modifications as may be necessary, from time to time.
- 3. Upon receipt of the Advisory and Payment Request Form, the owner of the violating vehicle shall pay to the Authority or its agent the proper toll and a violation fee of \$25.00 per violation.
- 4. If the owner of the vehicle with the toll violation offense fails to pay the required toll and violation fee within sixty (60) days of the date on which the Advisory and Payment Request Form was sent, the owner shall be subject to penalties authorized by N.J.S.A. 27-36.

Vice-Chairwoman Nunes moved to approve. Commissioner Tiver seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-34

RESOLUTION AWARDING A CONTRACT TO REMINGTON AND VERNICK FOR ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR THE INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY DEPARTMENT INCLUDING UPGRADING BRIDGE GATE CONTROL SYSTEM COMMUNICATION HARDWARE AND OTHER TASKS

WHEREAS, the Burlington County Bridge Commission ("Commission") requires the services of an engineering firm with expertise to provide engineering support for various Information Technology ("IT") Tasks at the Tacony-Palmyra Bridge and Burlington Bristol Bridge locations; and

WHEREAS, by way of a fair and open process authorized by N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 et seq., and upon receipt and review of a proposal submitted in response to the Commission's RFP for specialized engineering services, pursuant to Resolution No. 2020-78 the Commission determined that the Remington Vernick firm ("R&V") was qualified to serve the Commission, and

WHEREAS, the Commission also determined that R&V submitted a price proposal for specialized engineering services, which they have identified as Task 22, that provided

favorable contract terms and conditions for the Commission; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Burlington County Bridge Commission as follows:

- 1. The Executive Director and Secretary of the Commission are hereby authorized to execute an Agreement with R&V for engineering support for various IT Tasks at the Tacony-Palmyra and Burlington Bristol Bridge locations.
- 2. This contract is awarded through a fair and open process, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 19:44A-20.4 <u>et seq</u>.
- 3. The amount of the contract shall not exceed Thirty Two Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$32,600.00), and the contract shall extend for the time period from April 12, 2022 until the projects are completed.

Vice-Chairwoman Nunes moved to approve. Commissioner Tiver seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-35

RESOLUTION AWARDING A CONTRACT TO REMINGTON AND VERNICK FOR CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION SERVICES FOR BURLINGTON BRISTOL BRIDGE ROADWAY LIGHTING WIRE TESTING AND RIVERSIDE-DELANCO WARNING GATE POWER WIRING AND TRAFFIC SIGNAL CONTROL CIRCUIT REVISIONS

WHEREAS, the Burlington County Bridge Commission ("Commission") requires the services of an engineering firm with expertise to provide construction inspection services for Burlington Bristol Bridge roadway wiring testing, and for and Riverside-Delanco Bridge warning gate power wiring and traffic signal control circuit revisions; and

WHEREAS, by way of a fair and open process authorized by N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 et seq., and upon receipt and review of a proposal submitted in response to the Commission's RFP for specialized engineering services, pursuant to Resolution No. 2020-78 the Commission determined that the Remington Vernick firm ("R&V") was qualified to serve the Commission, and

WHEREAS, the Commission also determined that R&V submitted a price proposal for specialized engineering services, which they have identified as Task 23, that provided favorable contract terms and conditions for the Commission; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Burlington County Bridge Commission as follows:

- 1. The Executive Director and Secretary of the Commission are hereby authorized to execute an Agreement with R&V for construction inspection services for Burlington Bristol Bridge roadway wiring testing, and for and Riverside-Delanco Bridge warning gate power wiring and traffic signal control circuit revisions.
- 2. This contract is awarded through a fair and open process, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 et seq.
- 3. The amount of the contract shall not exceed Thirty Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$30,200.00), and the contract shall extend for the time period from April 12, 2022 until the projects are completed.

Vice-Chairwoman Nunes moved to approve. Commissioner Tiver seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-36

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE PURCHASE OF UP TO 100 TREES TO PROMOTE SUSTAINABILITY IN BURLINGTON COUNTY COMMUNITIES

WHEREAS, the Burlington County Bridge Commission ("Commission") has identified Sustainability as a desirable goal which can benefit Burlington County residents and Commission toll payers; and

WHEREAS, the Commission is committed to using its economic development and improvement authority powers for efforts that are consistent with the goals of the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has identified planting trees as one way to promote Sustainability, and also to generate environmental, economic, and communal benefits for Burlington County residents; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has determined that Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) will provide funding to purchase up to One Hundred (100) trees in Burlington County communities (the "Sustainability Trees").

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Burlington County Bridge Commission as follows:

1. The Commission authorizes the Executive Director to establish and oversee a Sustainability Trees project, which shall include the purchase and subsequent distribution of up to One Hundred (100) trees, at a total cost not to exceed Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00), to Burlington County communities.

- 2. The Executive Director shall administer the Sustainability Trees project according to Commission purchasing policies and in compliance with all applicable laws.
- 3. Sufficient funds are available for the purchase of the Sustainability Trees, as evidenced by the Certificate of Availability of Funds, attached.

Vice-Chairwoman Nunes moved to approve. Commissioner Tiver seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
